


I was homeschooled:)







Homeschooling in the USA



Sugar & OLPC

- Originally developed for the One Laptop Per Child (OLPC) program, and now available on nearly any computer.
- Nearly 3 million children speaking 25 languages in 40+ countries use Sugar.
- Sugar is available for download as an .iso image to burn to either a CD/DVD or USB stick.



- High-school & secondary school students ages 13-17
- November January since 2010
- Partners with Free & Open Source Software projects to come up with 'bite-sized tasks' for students to complete.

GNU/Linux in Schools Around the World

- Many countries are moving to free software around the world. A few highlights:
- Brazil: 35 million students in 50,000 schools with 500,000+ computers running Free Software.
- Spain: Extramadura moved to a complete open source desktop, installing Debian on 40,000+ desktop PCs.
- Thailand recently ordered 1.2 million Android/Linux tablets for students, with plans to equip 13 million students. (http://www.thephuketnews.com/thailand-orders-1-2-million-tablet-computers-for-pupils-40545.php

FOSS School Management

- OpenSIS: a secure, scalable & intiutive Student Information System.
 - Can be used for attendance, contact information, student demographics, grades, scheduling, health records & report cards.
 - Integrates with Moodle, Sugar & WordPress
 - 100% web-based application, written in PHP, using MySQL databases
- Epoptes: computer lab management & monitoring tool
 - Allows screen broadcasting & monitoring, remote command execution, command execution, message sending, etc.
 - Can be installed on Ubuntu, Debian & openSUSE
- Fedena: a student information system built on Ruby on Rails
 - Gives you complete control over your school's databases to organize activites, students, teachers, etc.
